Air quality improves at Dulwich during lockdown



Three [air quality monitoring](#) stations at Dulwich College - stationed at the main gate on the A205 South Circular, the Shackleton Building and at the Junior School gate on Hunt's Slip Road - record measurements throughout the day and our recent readings reflect the improvement to air quality seen across the capital. Detailed readings can be seen on these [charts](#) – they show readings for particulates (PM2.5), nitrogen dioxide (NO²) and ozone.

Community Support



During the past few weeks the College have been providing moral support for local care homes, Almshouses and hospices through community action projects. Our younger Alleynians have created beautiful and uplifting cards to send their best wishes to residents.

Our DT team of five pupils and staff have created over 2,500 PPE visors for surgeries, pharmacies, hospitals and care homes. Our second design has been [given BSI accreditation](#), enabling the recipients of the visors to use it in a close patient care situation. We are now in the midst of designing a new screen for ear, nose and throat specialists so they can safely treat patients who have tested positive for Covid-19.

We have opened College grounds beyond the immediate campus to the community and the main site as a local Covid-19 testing centre for key workers. We have been humbled and heartened by the warmth with which the local community has responded to these initiatives.

VE Day 75



3,320 Old Alleynians served during World War II. 330 died of wounds or were lost at sea; 115 were interned in Prisoner of War camps. Brigadier Lorne Campbell (1902-1991) and Captain Pip Gardner (1914-2003) were awarded the Victoria Cross, Major Herbert Barefoot was awarded the George Cross, and 33 other OAs the Distinguished Service Order. Age between 20 and 28 years, thirteen Old Alleynians took part in the Battle of Britain between August to October 1940; two won the Distinguished Flying Cross and eight lost their lives.
