Clubs Selection & Booking

Please review and discuss this Clubs' Directory with your sons and then use the online selection below to make your choices. **Please submit your choices no later than Friday 25th August 2017.**

When making your choices, please note the following:

- Boys must take part in a **minimum of two lunchtime clubs**, but are free to sign up to more if they wish
- After school, boys are permitted to do a **maximum of three clubs**. This is to ensure that all boys are successful in their choices
- Year 3 boys should do no more than four clubs in total and a maximum of two after school clubs
- Boys will need some free lunchtimes so they can socialise with their friends. Similarly, boys will need some free afternoons during the week so they do not become over tired.

Timings

From the end of school until 4:00pm, those boys who are staying for clubs will be given a short, supervised break on the Patball Courts to get some fresh air and have a drink and snack, which should be provided from home. After their club, boys should be collected from the Junior School main entrance at **5.00pm prompt**.

LAMDA

As LAMDA is a year long course, signing up now will ensure your son is enrolled in the LAMDA programme for the whole academic year.

Invitation Only Clubs

You will be notified at the start of next term whether your son has been invited to attend these clubs or musical ensembles. Some 'invitation only' clubs may require a period of observation of your son in the first couple of weeks of term to see whether they meet the criteria for that particular club or ensemble.

Homework Club & After School Care Club

Homework Club operates between 4:00pm and 5:00pm and our After School Care Club operates between 5:00pm and 6:00pm. Boys are welcome to attend **every night if they so wish**.

Charges for Homework Club & After School Care

3:45pm **School ends**

Any boy not collected by 4pm will be sent to the Patball Courts. At 4.10pm any boy not collected will be sent to Homework Club and parents will be charged accordingly.

4:00-5:00pm **Homework Club** Cost per session: £4

Children who have not been picked up by 5:10pm will be sent to After School Care Club and parents will be charged accordingly.

5:00-6:00pm **After School Care Club** Cost per session: £8

Please note that boys taking the Late Coach will be sent to After School Care after clubs and parents will be charged accordingly.

5:00-5:30pm **After School Care Club for boys taking the late coach.** Cost per session: £3

Collection after 6:00pm will incur a penalty charge of £20 per half-hour or part thereof.

We accept Childcare Vouchers as payment for Homework Club and After School Care Club. In order to use these vouchers you will need to register with your company's provider using the information listed in the table below. Please note that childcare vouchers are also accepted at DUCKS (our kindergarten and infants school) so it is very important that you use these details and disregard the information you may have received at DUCKS.

****Year 3 – 6 French Club**

I am very pleased to welcome you and your sons to my French club. I hope they will enjoy learning and practicing their French while having fun participating in various activities and games.

The age two to eleven is the optimum time for children to learn a second language. This is the time when they have the greatest facility to pick up the different sounds and nuances of a foreign language. Even if they are not able to speak fluently it is important for them to hear the maximum amount of different sounds and accents. It is with this idea in mind that I have created this club, which I hope will give them the opportunity to learn French while playing and so make the whole exercise effortless. I am also planning to introduce them to the French culture with some customary greetings, table habits and celebrations. **Year 4 – 6 Beginners' Russian Club

Beginners' Russian club, run by an external teacher Elena Merkoulouva, will meet every week on Wednesday at 13:35-14:15. The club aims to develop boys' knowledge and interest in the Russian language and culture and stretch their linguistic knowledge.

English and Russian have the same Indo-European linguistic origins and behind the exotic-looking alphabet there is a simple system of pronunciation and large number of familiar words. Beginners Russian club makes the learning of the new language fun and within the first five sessions boys learn the Cyrillic script and acquire first conversational, reading and writing skills as well as build up their vocabulary to about 100 words and phrases.

An equally important part is the study of the customs and traditions. During the Michaelmas term boys will be watching and discussing National Geographic "Wild Russia" documentary, assembling the map of Russia with their own hands, and watching the new Russian film "The Spacewalker", 2017. If boys decide to continue with Russian, they will be participating in the year-end production project along with other boys from the Junior, Lower and Middle School.

This specialist club will cost each boy £110 (£10 per session) which includes tuition, textbooks, books and all necessary study materials as well as individual progress reports.

It welcomes heritage learners who already have some grasp of the language (though absolute beginners can still attend) and is run in Russian. The club aims to develop interest in Russian culture and deepen boys' knowledge of Russian language. It helps the boys to widen their vocabulary, reading, speaking and translating skills. But, perhaps more importantly, the club offers the boys in Dulwich College a social platform for communicating with their schoolmates in Russian and for developing a bridge between the countries and their cultures. This specialist club will cost each boy £110 (£10 per session) which includes tuition, textbooks, books and all necessary study materials as well as individual progress reports.
